My experience of visiting the Buniyaad Nursery and Playgroup schools was an amazing one. Having been a teacher myself, i am aware of the necessary infrastructure required for running a play school and since these centers were run for the under privileged, I was not expecting much. But what I saw

really overwhelmed me. Despite having limited resources the teachers in their own unique way are doing their best .I was very impressed by the class display, the efforts taken to make flashcards, number charts etc. Of course all this is possible only because of the unstinted support from the volunteers. I found the teachers to be very motivated and they made good efforts to interact with the children in English. The curriculum designed for Buniyaad is also very comprehensive right from the bhajans, shlokas, nursery rhymes, the stories to the worksheets.

Personally, for me too it has been a very humbling as well as an enriching experience.

I want to thank all the members of Buniyaad for giving me this wonderful opportunity. I really appreciate all of you for supporting such a noble cause.
